Position runs June 1, 2023 through August 18, 2023. You must be available 30 hours a week and funding is dependent on start date - 11 week duration.

Stipend and travel reimbursement available to BIPOC qualified students.

BIPOC Scholarship Funding Eligibility;

Student is currently a candidate for graduation and in good academic standing and receiving maximum Pell Grant for educational support

Preference for this award is to first be given to students as close to Zero EFC as possible (Expected Family Contribution) as determined by the FAFSA. Should no qualifying students with Zero EFC apply, CHP may select a qualifying student with the next highest EFC not to exceed \$5,000. Students will be required to provide proof of eligibility through their respective financial aid office.

Represent an underserved community; first-generation student, BIPOC (Black, Indigenous or People of Color) or low-income eligibility

Please provide written recommendations from one professor or faculty member and one community leader in order to apply for this position.

Community Harvest Project (CHP), a 501(c)3 organization, is dedicated to creating healthy and engaged communities through volunteer farming and nutrition education for those who are experiencing food insecurity. Through their volunteer farming, education, and leadership programs they bring thousands of community members together each year. In 2022 they hosted 6,076 volunteer visits that allowed for 1.4 million servings of fruits and vegetables to be grown and donated through partnerships including the Worcester County Food Bank's hunger relief network, Community Servings, and Hector Reyes House. Community Harvest Project provides a significant amount of nutritious, fresh produce for individuals and families experiencing food insecurity in Eastern and Central Massachusetts.
